The Silver Buffalo Award, created in 1925, is bestowed upon those who give truly noteworthy and extraordinary service to youth. This award, Scouting's highest commendation, recognizes the invaluable contributions that outstanding American men and women render to youth. The service must be national or international in character and may or may not be directly connected with Scouting America. To prevent embarrassment, the candidate should not be notified of the nomination.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. This official nomination form must be used.
- 2. Give the nominee's full name and title; avoid the use of nicknames.
- 3. Provide as much information as necessary using the space provided on this form. No additional documents should be attached other than supporting letters of recommendation and a clear photo of the nominee (head shot). Photo is to be no larger than 4 inches by 6 inches.
- 4. Supporting letters are accepted electronically and should provide supporting evidence of worthiness to earn the award, not just personal recommendations or endorsements.
- 5. Incomplete nominations will not be considered.
- 6. Nominations cannot be considered for posthumous awards.
- 7. Members of the National Court of Honor shall not submit, recommend or support any specific nomination.
- 8. Individuals shall not nominate themselves.
- Unsuccessful nominations shall not be rolled over for the Committee consideration in the next or future years. Individuals who have been nominated in the past, but not selected, must be renominated in full pursuant to these instructions.
- 10. Nomination forms along with no more than two recommendation letters must be submitted together electronically with this form to the National Service Center at awards@scouting.org no later than August 31 for recognition the following year. If you wish to include a photo of the nominee with this form, please attach it here. (head and shoulders shot only, no larger than 4" x 6").

RULES AND REGULATIONS of SCOUTING AMERICA

Article VII1 Silver Buffalo Award

Scouting America may award the Silver Buffalo for distinguished service to citizens of the United States upon the following basis and procedure:

- (a) These awards may be made each year.
- (b) The award is made on the basis of noteworthy service to youth, of a national or international character, outside of the line of regular duty, either directly to or independent of Scouting America.
- (c) As evidence of the award there will be presented: a suitable certificate, descriptive of the services rendered, duly authenticated by Scouting America, pursuant to the action of the Executive Board; and a miniature silver buffalo, suspended by a red, white, and red ribbon to be worn around the neck.
- (d) These awards will be made at the meeting of the National Council or at a major function of Scouting America, pursuant to the action of the Executive Board, which action is to be based upon the recommendation to the Executive Board by the National Court of Honor, or by recommendations to the Executive Board by the National Chair and the Chief Executive Officer.
